

Administrator Feedback



Kinder Camp student behaviors have been very solid. We have not experienced any excessive behaviors other than those that would be attributed to any Kindergarten student for the first time entering a school environment. As a whole, I believe that the behaviors--even those that were anticipated--were far less severe than in past years and the longevity was far less.

The Kinder Camp students seemed to be ready for school as much as any kindergarten student can be. The camp definitely showed an improvement of students being better prepared for the "routines" of school and allowed students to assimilate much quicker to the classroom expectations.

In past years, many of our campers would have set the bottom score in our BOY Dibels assessments simply because they had no prior experience with a typical classroom environment. Many of our campers scored in the RED for overall composite scores, but I believe they were higher than what I would have anticipated without going to camp. We also had campers in the other categories as well.

Overall, I believe that the camp showed significant positive results both in behaviors and readiness. I do believe that the camp had an impact on the Dibels assessment, but it is hard to measure since they do not take this assessment prior to arrival in kindergarten.

No, we have not spent less time with Kindergarten issues this year. We have more kindergarten students than we have ever had in this building (78). Even with four teachers there are several students who have never been to preschool or there are several who are "heavy hitters". KinderCamp was an amazing transition for students entering kindergarten. Students were confident as they entered their classrooms. Teachers were able to make connections with students and families before the school year began.


